Application Period Application Material Required Academic year 2015/16: Spring Semester 2016: 1 September – 1 October 2015. Online application including a course selection form, transcript of records, proof of English (if applicable).

Language Requirements

Students whose mother tongue is not English must provide evidence that their English language ability meets the minimum requirements for admission.

Students from the Nordic countries do not need to take a test.

IELTS: 6.0 overall with at least 5.5 in each of the four components, TOEFL: PBT 550, iBT 79. Please notice that no results from TOEFL ITP tests will be accepted.
